Report of Aranya Saptah (Forest Week) observation

The NSS unit and Students' Welfare Committee of Swarnamoyee Jogendranath Mahavidyalaya organized an Aranya Saptah (Forest Week) observation event on the 14th of July, 2020. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the event was conducted online via Google Meet. The primary focus of the event was to raise awareness about the importance of forests and to promote tree planting activities.

Prof. Aparesh Mondal (Dept. of Geography), the resource person, delivered an insightful lecture on the significance of forests in maintaining ecological balance and combating climate change. The lecture emphasized the role of individual actions in environmental conservation and encouraged participants to take proactive steps in preserving their local environment.

Participants, including students, NSS volunteers, and villagers, engaged in an interactive discussion with Aparesh Mondal. Next part of event was plantation saplings. Keeping in mind the risk to participants' health due to covid-19, participants were encouraged to plant saplings in their own house areas. A total of 35 students joined alongwith NSS volunteers and villagers. After the plantation the programme ended.

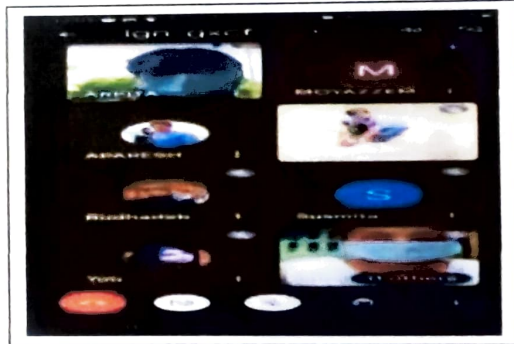
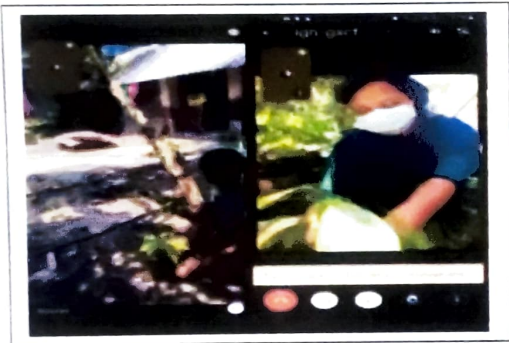
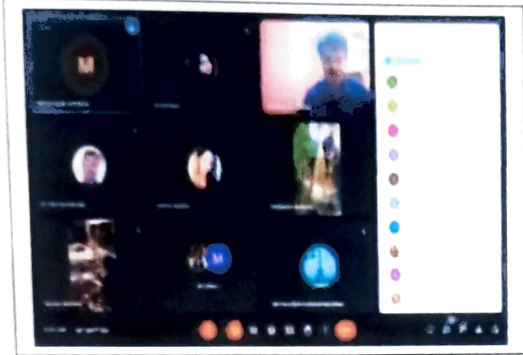
