### COURSE OUTCOMES OF GENERAL COURSES UNDER CBCS w.e.f. 2018-19

#### CORE COURSES (CC)

##### DSC1A (CC-1): Ancient India

6 credits

**DSC1AT: Ancient India** The course covers the history from the Harappan Civilization to the end of the Gupta Empire and India after Guptas.

- Students will learn about the prehistoric times in the Indian subcontinent.
- Students will learn about the ancient Indian political, social, economic, and cultural history.
- Students will be introduced to an ancient Indian society that was not static.
- Students will be able to appreciate the high culture of the classical age of ancient India
- Students will be introduced to India's being a multi religious country even before the advent of Islam in the sub-continent.

##### DSC1B (CC-2): Medieval India

6 credits

**DSC1BT: Medieval India:** The course covers the history from the invasion of Arabs to the Mughal empire.

- Students will learn about the political history of the Sultanate and Mughal rule in India
- Students will be able to appreciate the high Persianate culture of the medieval times
- Students will be able to analyze the economic and socio the pre-modern states that rose on the pillars of agricultural growth.
- Students will be able to discern the areas of conflict and the areas of the confluence of Indian and Perso-Islamic culture.

**DSC1C(CC-3): Select themes in the Colonial impact on Indian Economy and Society**

**6 credits**

**DSC1CT: Select themes in the Colonial impact on Indian Economy and Society:** The course covers the economic and social history of modern India.

- Students will be able to analyze the character of British colonialism.
- Students will gain an understanding of how India was economically drained by the British empire.
- Students will be able to analyze how the Indians reacted to British rule and their ideology.
- Students will learn about shaped the modern Hindu and Muslim minds.

**DSC1D (CC-4): Modern Nationalism in India**

**6 credits**

**DSC1DT: Modern Nationalism in India:** The course covers the history of nationalism, which was conducted against the British Government.

- Students will learn about the various approaches to the study of modern nationalism in India.
- Students will be able to distinguish different colonial struggles in India.
- Students will be able to see in perspective many voices from Indian society.
- Students will be able to trace the origins of communalism in India and analyze how India was partitioned.

**DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC ELECTIVES (DSE)**

**DSE-1A: Renaissance and Reformation**

**6 credits**

**DSE1AT: Renaissance and Reformation:** The course covers the foundation of modern Europe. After completion this course.

- Students will learn about the political, economic, and socio-cultural developments in pre-modern Europe.
- Students will learn about the renewed interest in the works of antiquity during the Renaissance and how it shaped the modern mind.
- Students will learn about the religious reformation in Europe.
- Students will become aware of the dangers of the persecuting spirit of religious enthusiasm.
- Students will learn about the development of national monarchies and modern states.

- Students will be able to trace the origins of the scientific revolution and its impact.

### **DSE-1B: Modern Europe**

**6 credits**

**DSE1B: Modern Europe:** The course covers the history from the beginning of French Revolution to the Second World War. After completion this course.

- Students will come to know the meaning and impact of the Enlightenment.
- Student will learn about the great Bourgeois Revolution in France in 1789.
- Students will learn about the rise and fall of Napoleon.
- Students will be able to analyze the interplay of forces of change and forces of continuity in 19th Century Europe and the resultant liberal revolutions.
- Students will learn about the causes and process of industrialization in England and its differences from those in Europe.
- Students will be able to analyze the failure of diplomacy and the causes of the 1st and 2nd World Wars. They will realize the dangers the totalitarian powers posed to the civilization.

### **SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC)**

#### **SEC-1: The Making of Indian Foreign Policy**

**2 credits**

**SEC-1: The Making of Indian Foreign Policy:** The course covers the History of India's foreign policy and the relationship with the neighbours. After completion this course.

- Students will acquire the knowledge on Making of Indian Foreign Policy
- Students will appreciate India's role as a non-aligned country in the international relations.

#### **SEC-2: Literature and History: Bengal**

**2 credits**

**SEC-2: Literature and History: Bengal:** The course covers the discussion and explanation of about many eminent poets and Litterateurs.

- Students will be introduced to discussion of the relations between history and literature.
- Students will be acquainted with the major Bengali novels that have historical bearings on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>-century society and politics.
- Students will appreciate the different notions of nationalism and internationalism.

**2 credits**

**SEC-3: Colonial Science in India: Institutions and Practices:** The course covers the discussion and explanation of about colonial science.


- Students will understand how the spread of modern science was deployed by the colonial rulers to exploit the colony.

- Students will appreciate the roles of the personalities like Bethune, Vidyasagar, Rokeya Sakhawat in the sphere of women's education.
- Students will become aware of the limitations and obstacles to women's education to be overcome.
