DSC1A (CC1)	6	Introduction to Sociology	Students will gain a deeper comprehension of sociology as a field, its history, and how it differs from other social sciences. In essence, understanding society and beginning to think from a sociological perspective are aided by this course.
DSC1B (CC2)	6	Sociology of India	Students will get a deeper understanding of rural social structure, the caste system, the agricultural economic system, and general social difficulties and challenges in pre- and post-British India through this course.
DSC1C (CC3)	6	Sociological Theories	This course introduces students to the ways in which sociological theorising provides a framework for discussing, describing, and making sense of a wide range of human actions with the goal of strengthening our social convictions.
DSC1D (CC4)	6	Methods of Sociological Enquiry	This course equips students with both the theoretical understanding and practical skills necessary for scientific inquiry.
DSE1	6	Social Stratification	This course introduces students to sociological thinking about social order, ranking, social role and status, category of people by different type of profession, education, race, ethnicity etc. Also social stratification defines social justice, inequality, role conflict, social issues and challenges.
