MINOR COURSES (MI)

Semester I

MI1 Nationalism and Anti-colonial Movements in India

4 credits

CO1: Students will gain an understanding of the various theoretical perspectives on the emergence and development of nationalism in India.

CO2: Students will gain knowledge of the historical trajectory of the nationalist movement in India, with a specific focus on its different phases.

CO3: Students will learn about the contributions of various social movements to the anti-colonial struggle.

CO4: Students will gain an awareness of the history of Partition and the moment of independence that followed.

Semester II
MI2 Gender Studies

4 credits

CO1: Students will gain a clear understanding of how gender roles and perspectives have shaped the development of gender studies.

CO2: Students will gain an understanding of how gender functions as a political construct, influenced by and influencing sex, power, and culture, and equip them to critically analyse and engage with these issues in various contexts.

CO3: Students will learn in depth about women's roles as political actors, their participation and representation challenges, and the strategies needed to promote gender equality in political spheres.

CO4: Students will gain an exposure to core feminist political theories, such as liberal and Marxist feminism, as well as the different waves of feminism.

CO5: Students will learn in depth about the Indian context: political participation through the 73rd and 74th constitutional amendments, and issues of women's human rights.

CO6: Students will gain a clear understanding of patriarchy as a social system, including its historical origins and theoretical foundations.

CO7: Students will gain a comprehensive understanding of the economic challenges and opportunities for women and be equipped to advocate for and develop solutions to promote gender equity in economic spheres.
