Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

SWARNAMOYEE JOGENDRANATH MAHA VIDYALAYAA, PURBA MEDINIPUR, West Bengal was established on 2014. Total area 4.65 Acres, Buildup area 7050 sq.mts The college managed by Swarnamoyee Jogendranath Mahavidyalaya Educational Promotion and welfare Trust, Affiliated to **VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY**, it is the Government-Aided General Degree COLLEGE and socially unprivileged and financially weaker students are admitted mostly from RURAL AREAS. The college offers **BA Honours** and general 3-year degree course under **CBCS in the disciplines of** Bengali, Education, English, Sanskrit, Sociology, Geography, Humanities, Life Science. The curriculum is designed and developed by **VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY** and the Affiliating University. **2f of UGC order 30-01-2022**. Total Faculty members 25 (Ph.D. 6, M.Phil 3, PG 16, Part time PG 3). The percentage of full-time teachers against sanctioned posts is 96.33 for the last five years. The number of faculty members who have PhDs is increasing gradually: from 2 in the first year of the assessment period, it has grown to 5 in the last year, and at the moment of writing, stands at 6. The college follows the Academic calendar of events issued by the University and Curriculum prescribed by the University.

The different committees of Teachers decide the planning for teaching/evaluation which is informed to the students through Notice Boards in advance. The college plans its Academic, Co-Curricular and Extra curriculum activities based on the schedule provided. The college follows the semester system of the Examination under the CBCS and NEP since 2023. The college has Alumni Association registered on 7Th August 2023. The association started its activities.

Topics related to Gender sensibility, Environmental sustainability, Human values and professional ethics are added to the programs. At the end of each of the Academic year feedback is obtained from stake holders and the data of feedback is published on the college Website. The analyzed data provide overall information about Teaching and Curriculum Activities. Students belonging to SC/ST categories are given financial benefits by the State Government Norms.

The library uses ILMS for library management system. The Wi-Fi facility is also provided to the students partially. Library of the college is 03 computers with ILMS software. 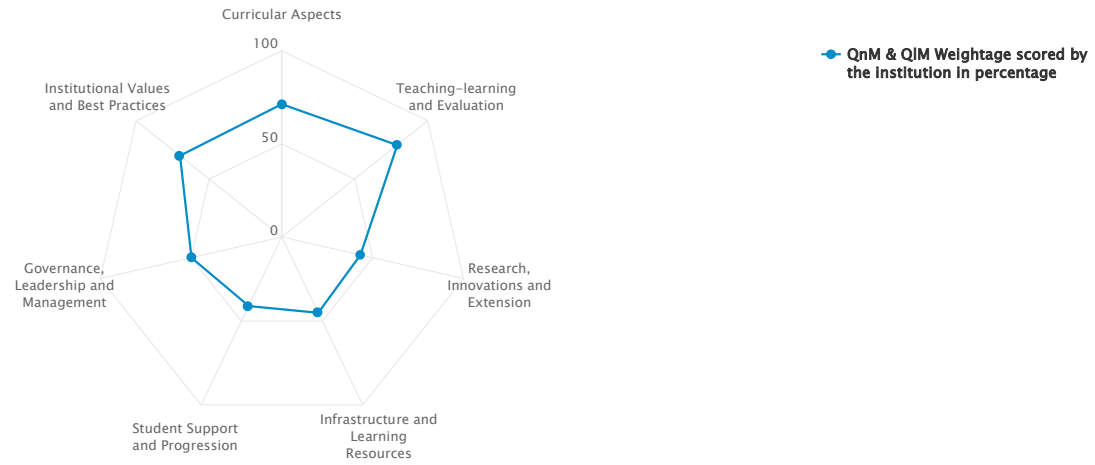
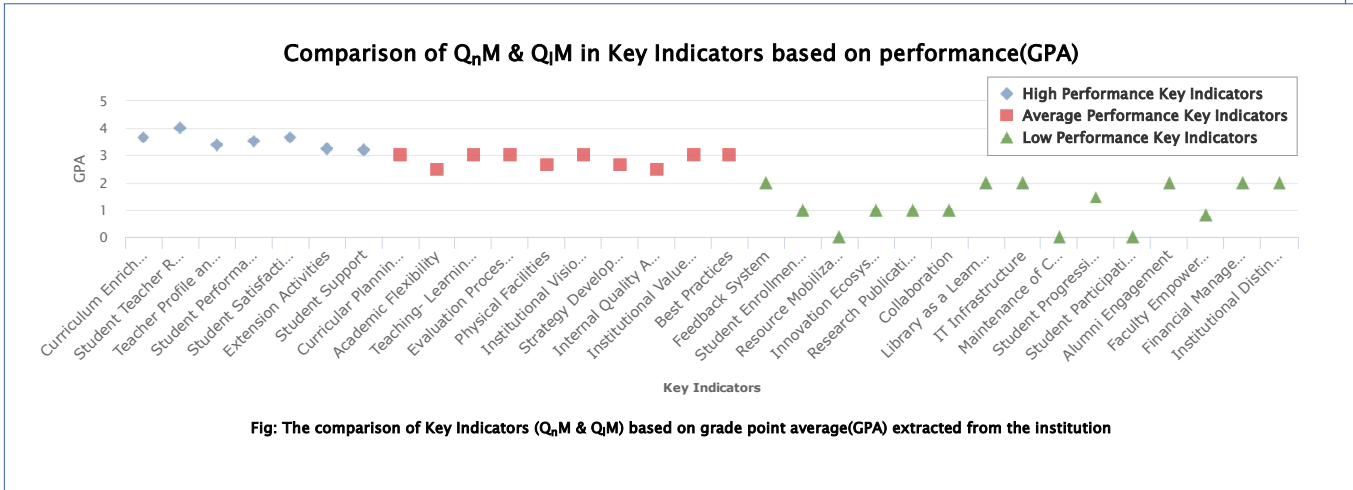
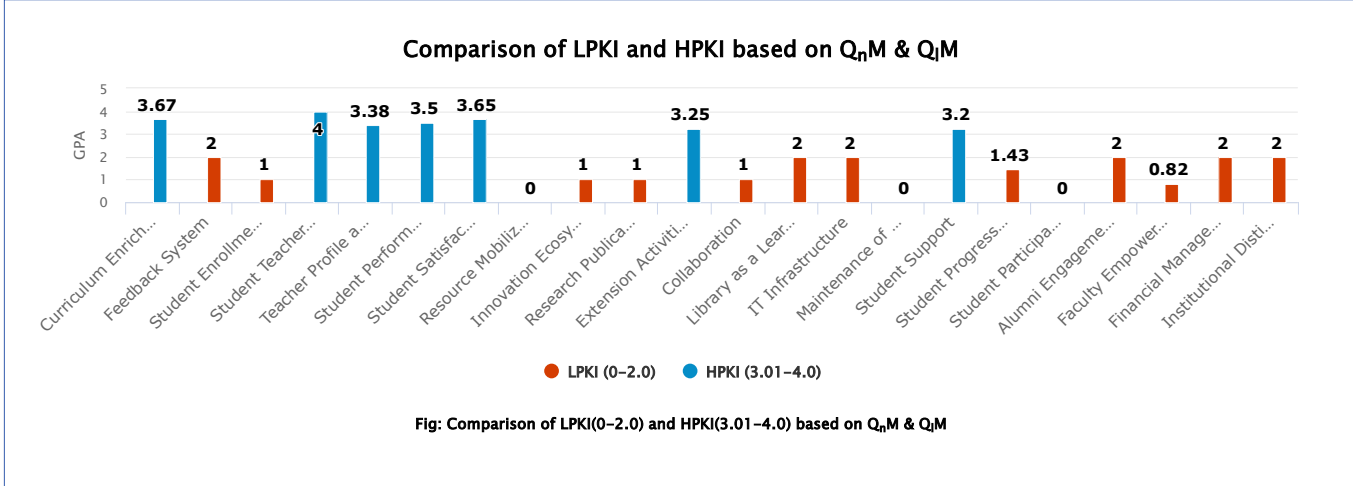


Fig: The criterion wise distribution of weighted scores (Q_nM & Q_iM) for the institution





Distribution of High Performance Key Indicators (3.01–4.0)

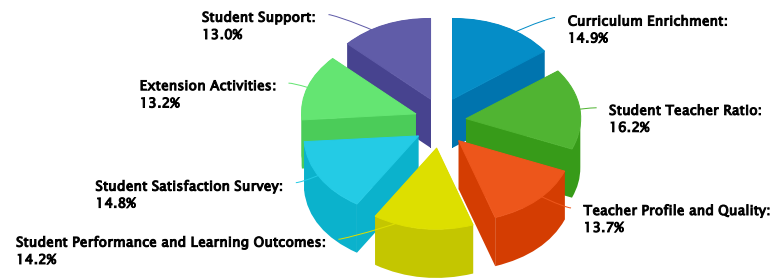


Fig: High Performance Key Indicators(3.01–4.0) for the institution

Distribution of Average Performance Key Indicators (2.01–3.0)

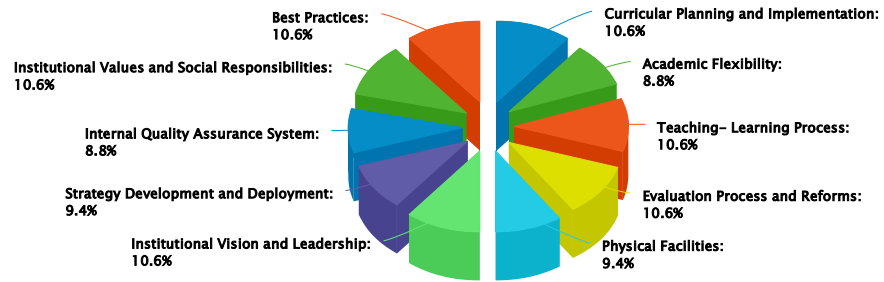


Fig: Average Performance Key Indicators(2.01–3.0) for the Institution

Distribution of Low Performance Key Indicators (0–2.0)

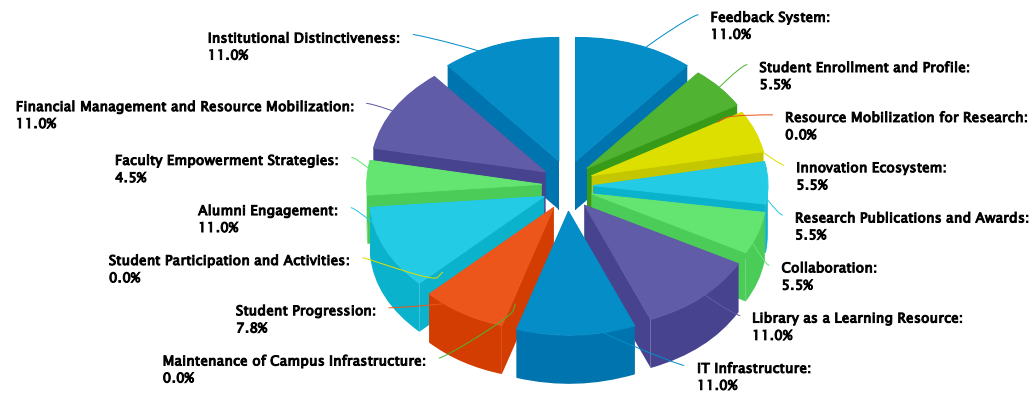
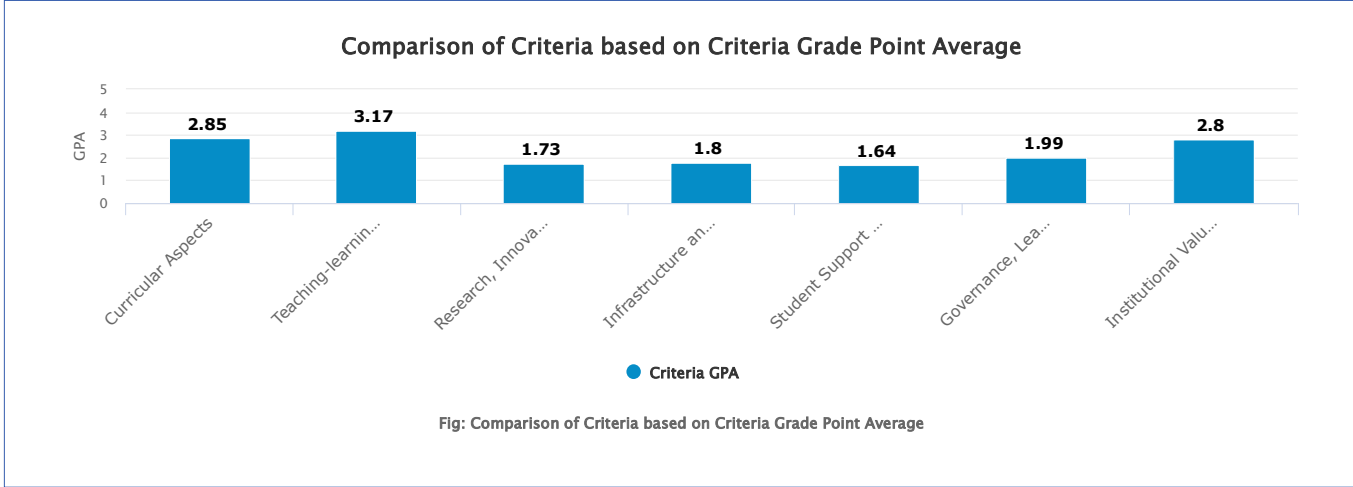
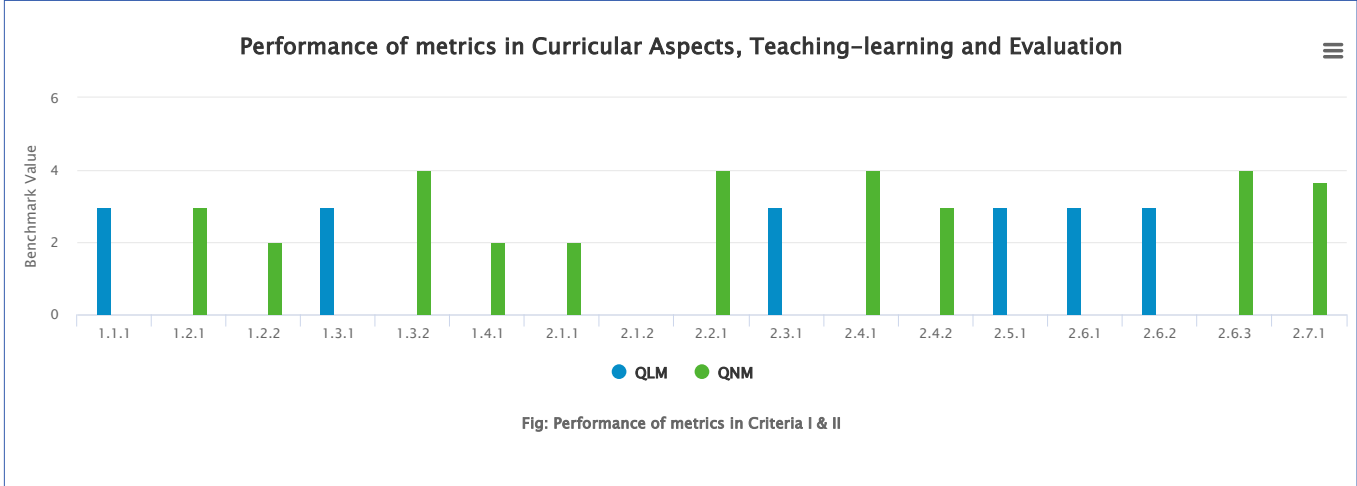
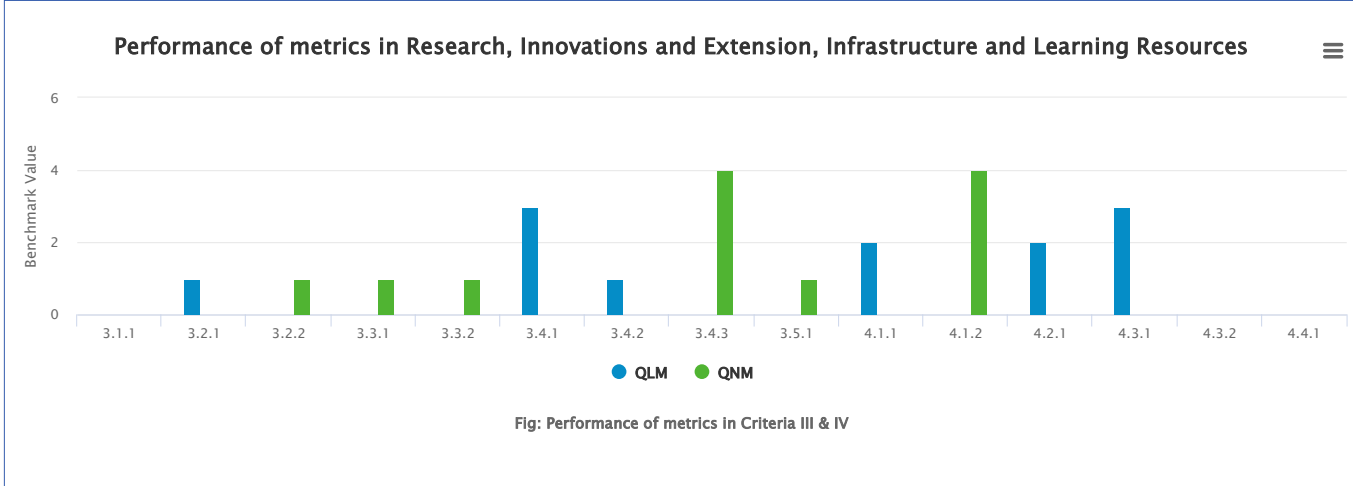
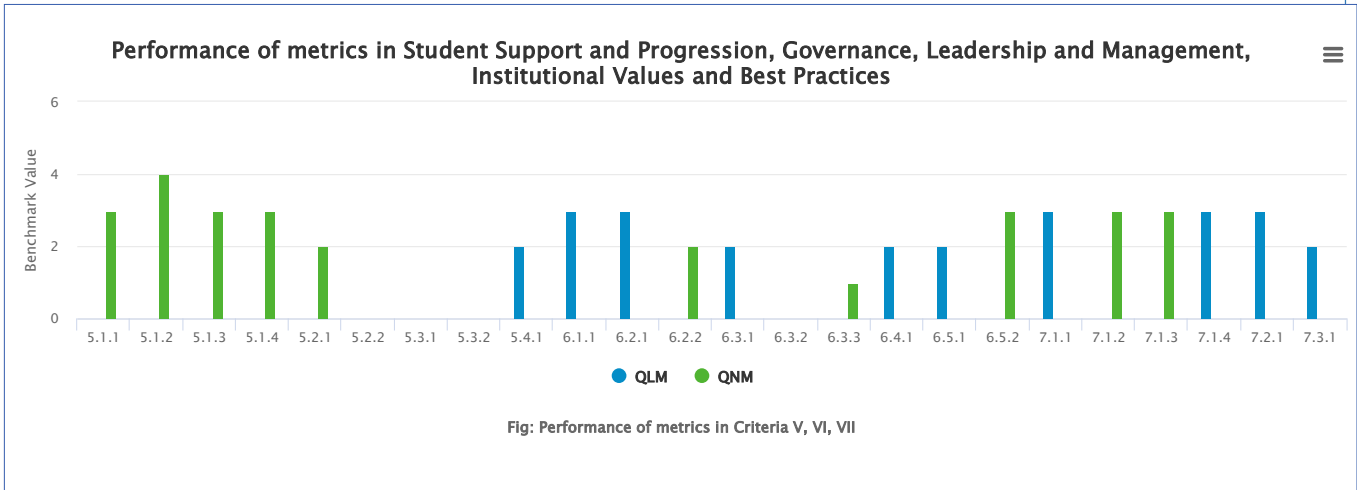


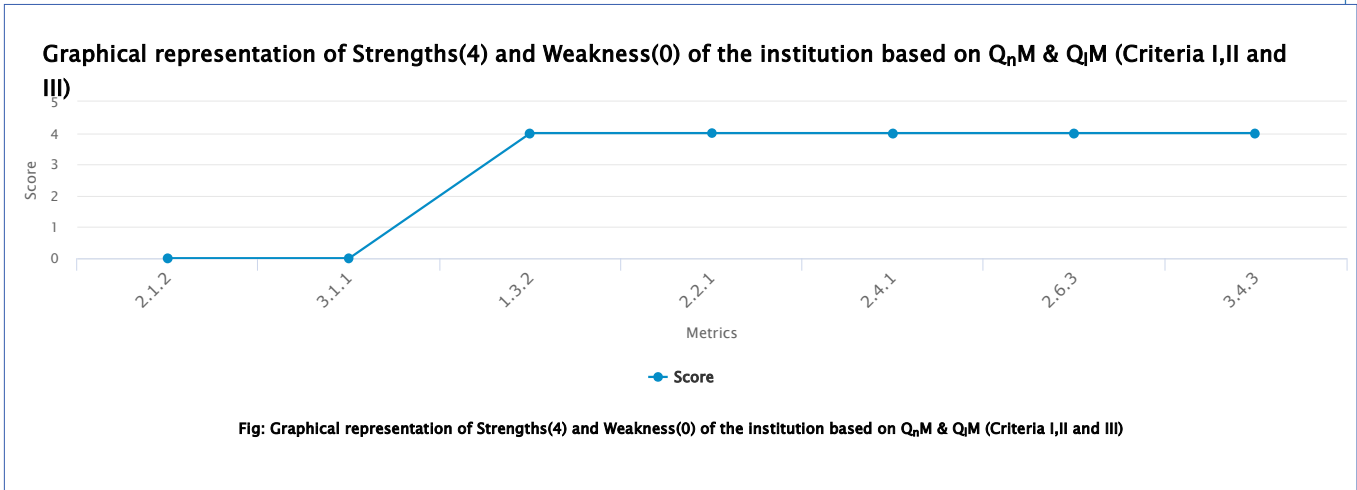
Fig: Low Performance Key Indicators(0–2.0) for the institution

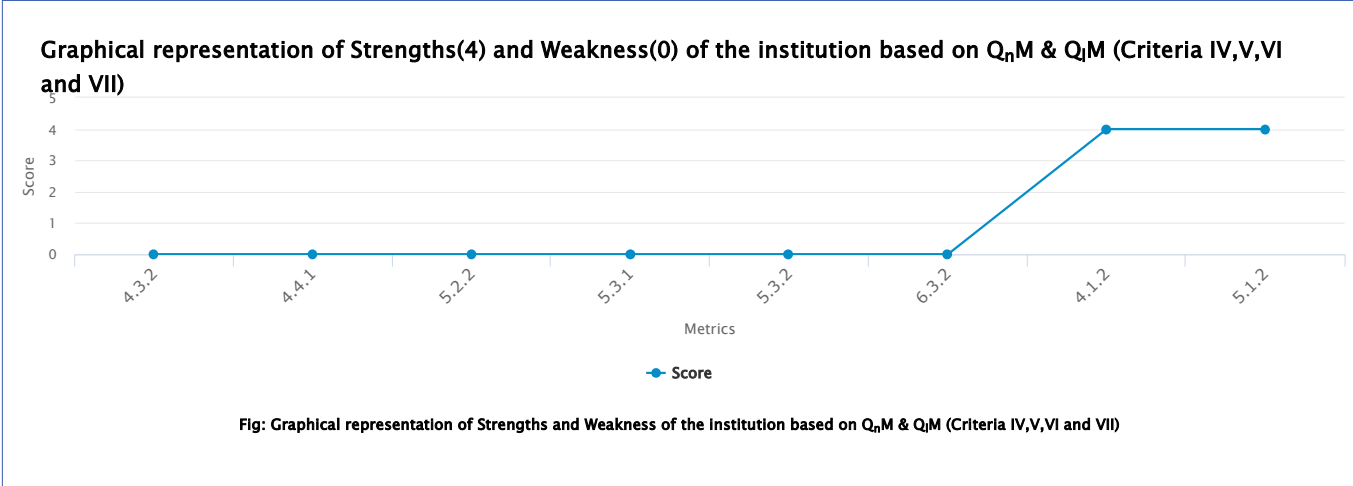












Graphical representation of Strengths and Weakness of the institution based on Q_nM & Q_iM (Criteria I,II and III)

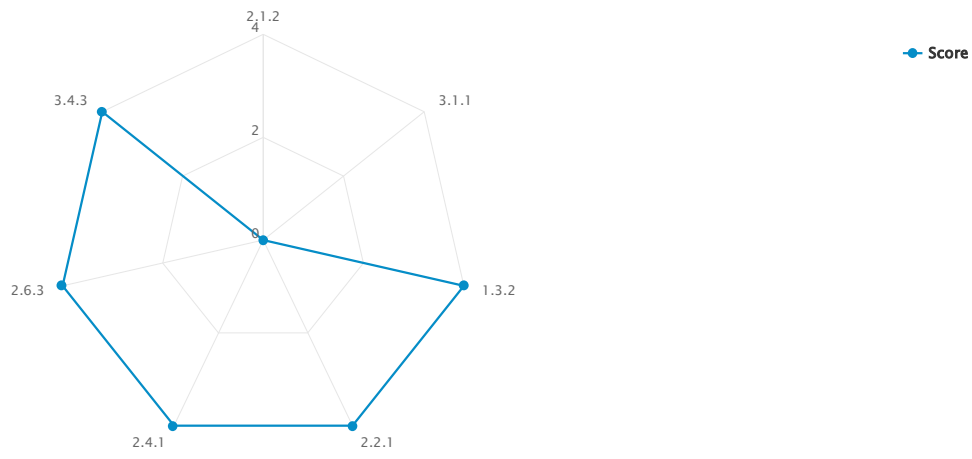


Fig: Graphical representation of Strengths(4) and Weakness(0) of the institution based on Q_nM & Q_iM (Criteria I,II and III)

Graphical representation of Strengths and Weakness of the institution based on Q_nM & Q_iM (Criteria IV,V,VI and VII)

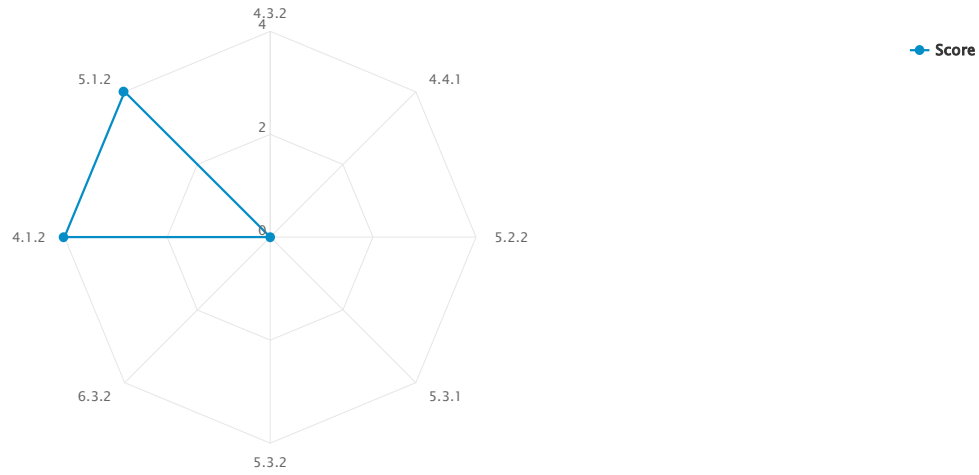


Fig: Graphical representation of Strengths and Weakness of the Institution based on Q_nM & Q_iM (Criteria IV,V,VI and VII)
